

Abraham Bible Reading Plan

A great way to study the Bible is the H.E.A.R. method. There are four steps to it...

The Four Steps of H.E.A.R.

H - Highlight (Highlight the Text):

After reading, identify a verse or two that stands out to you. Maybe a phrase that sticks out to you. Then write out that verse or part by hand.

E - Explain (Understand the Context):

In your own words, explain what the passage means. Write a few sentences explaining what you think the original audience was supposed to hear.

A - Apply (Personalize the Truth):

Think about how the verse applies to your life today. So, this is personal. What God is saying to you from His Word.

R - Respond (Take Action):

Respond to what you've learned by writing a short prayer or a commitment to action, based on what God has spoken to you.

WEEK 1

Mon – Genesis 12:1–9

Summary: God calls Abram to leave his country and promises to make him a great nation.

Tue – Genesis 12:10–20

Summary: Abram travels to Egypt during a famine and lies about Sarai to protect himself.

Wed – Genesis 13:1–13

Summary: Abram and Lot separate because their herds are too large to stay together.

Thu – Genesis 13:14–18

Summary: God promises the entire land of Canaan to Abram and his descendants forever.

Fri – Genesis 14:1–16

Summary: Abram rescues Lot after a war between kings.

WEEK 2

Mon – Genesis 14:17–24

Summary: Melchizedek blesses Abram, and Abram gives him a tenth of everything.

Tue – Genesis 15:1–11

Summary: God promises Abram countless descendants and reassures him of His protection.

Wed – Genesis 15:12–21

Summary: God makes a covenant with Abram and promises him the land.

Thu – Genesis 16:1–16

Summary: Sarai gives Hagar to Abram; Hagar flees into the wilderness and meets God.

Fri – Genesis 17:1–8

Summary: God changes Abram's name to Abraham and renews His covenant promises.

WEEK 3

Mon – Genesis 17:9–14

Summary: God commands circumcision as the sign of the covenant.

Tue – Genesis 17:15–27

Summary: God renames Sarai to Sarah and promises she will bear a son named Isaac.

Wed – Genesis 18:1–15

Summary: Three visitors tell Abraham that Sarah will have a son; Sarah laughs in disbelief.

Thu – Genesis 18:16–33

Summary: Abraham boldly pleads with God to spare Sodom if righteous people are found.

Fri – Genesis 19:1–14

Summary: Angels visit Lot in Sodom and warn him to flee before destruction comes.

WEEK 4

Mon – Genesis 19:15–29

Summary: Sodom and Gomorrah are destroyed; Lot's wife turns into a pillar of salt.

Tue – Genesis 20:1–18

Summary: Abraham again claims Sarah is his sister, but God protects her in Abimelech's house.

Wed – Genesis 21:1–7

Summary: Sarah gives birth to Isaac, and Abraham circumcises him as God commanded.

Thu – Genesis 21:8–21

Summary: Hagar and Ishmael are sent away, but God cares for them in the desert.

Fri – Genesis 21:22–34

Summary: Abraham and Abimelech make a treaty and dig a well at Beersheba.

WEEK 5

Mon – Genesis 22:1–8

Summary: God tests Abraham by asking him to sacrifice his son Isaac.

Tue – Genesis 22:9–14

Summary: Abraham prepares to sacrifice Isaac, but God provides a ram instead.

Wed – Genesis 22:15–24

Summary: God reaffirms His covenant blessings because of Abraham's obedience.

Thu – Genesis 23:1–20

Summary: Sarah dies, and Abraham buys a cave to bury her in the Promised Land.

Fri – Genesis 24:1–14

Summary: Abraham sends his servant to find a wife for Isaac from his homeland.

WEEK 6

Mon – Genesis 24:15–33

Summary: The servant meets Rebekah at the well, and she shows great kindness.

Tue – Genesis 24:34–49

Summary: The servant explains God's guidance and asks for Rebekah to go with him.

Wed – Genesis 24:50–67

Summary: Rebekah agrees to marry Isaac and becomes his wife.

Thu – Genesis 25:1–6

Summary: Abraham marries Keturah and has more children before his death.

Fri – Genesis 25:7–11

Summary: Abraham dies at 175 years old and is buried with Sarah by his sons.
